Case Log Instructions for the CSAVP and CASVM

Ophthalmology



Case log explanations and instructions:

The case log for the ESAVS Certificate / Ophthalmology shall contain at least 100 cases mostly compiled in the second half of the program.

The following cases categories are mandatory:

- 1. at least 10 cases of eyelid disease
- 2. at least 20 cases of corneal disease
- 3. at least 10 cases of uveal tract disease
- 4. at least 10 cases of lens disease
- 5. at least 10 cases of retinal disease
- 6. at least 10 cases of glaucoma

For each case, the following information is mandatory (information is provided as an example)

- 1. **Date**: 11 January 2017
- 2. Name or file number: XY, File 12345
- 3. Species, breed, age: Dog, Labrador, 6 Y
- 4. Major complain/ Problem: painful eye for 1 week
- 5. **Examination**: clinical examination involving focal illumination and magnification, Schirmer tear test, topical dyes, local anaesthesia, slit lamp examination (biomicroscopy), tonometry
- 6. Final diagnosis: deep corneal ulceration
- 7. **Treatment**: antibiosis, atropine, conjunctival pedicle graft
- 8. Complications/Results: wound breakdown 3 days following surgery
- 9. Follow-up: new conjunctival graft applied
- 10. Your comment: initial sutures placed in necrotic cornea
- 11. Code: C (for cornea)

The case log needs to be compiled as an Excel file using the template in the appendix.

Abbreviations may be used but must be explained at the beginning of the case log table. List the cases in chronological order.

A case log may not be acceptable and may be rejected in its entirety if critical concerns regarding one or more categories result in a fail, regardless of whether all other required criteria are adequately met.
